15105132D HOUSE BILL NO. 2071 1 2 AMENDMENT IN THE NATURE OF A SUBSTITUTE 3 (Proposed by the Senate Committee on General Laws and Technology 4 on February 16, 2015) 5 (Patron Prior to Substitute—Delegate McClellan) 6 A BILL to amend the Code of Virginia by adding in Chapter 24 of Title 2.2 an article numbered 25, 7 consisting of sections numbered 2.2-2478 through 2.2-2483, relating to the Advisory Board on 8 Service and Volunteerism. 9 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia: 1. That the Code of Virginia is amended by adding in Chapter 24 of Title 2.2 an article numbered 10 11 25, consisting of sections numbered 2.2-2478 through 2.2-2483, as follows: 12 Article 25. 13 Advisory Board on Service and Volunteerism. 14 § 2.2-2478. Advisory Board on Service and Volunteerism; purpose. 15 A. The Advisory Board on Service and Volunteerism (the Board) is established as an advisory board, within the meaning of § 2.2-2100, in the executive branch of state government to advise the Governor 16 17 and Cabinet Secretaries on matters related to promotion and development of national service in the 18 Commonwealth and to meet the provisions of the federal National and Community Service Trust Act of 19 1993. 20 § 2.2-2479. Membership; terms; quorum; meetings. 21 The Board shall consist of no more than 20 nonlegislative citizen members, to be appointed by the 22 Governor from the Commonwealth at large. Nonlegislative citizen members appointed to the Board shall 23 be selected for their knowledge of, background in, or experience with the community and volunteer 24 services sector and in accordance with guidelines provided in the National and Community Service 25 Trust Act of 1993. The Governor may appoint additional persons at his discretion, as nonvoting 26 members. 27 B. After the initial staggering of terms, nonlegislative citizen members shall be appointed for terms of 28 four years. Appointments to fill vacancies shall be for the unexpired terms. No nonlegislative citizen 29 member shall be eligible to serve more than two successive four-year terms; however, after the 30 expiration of the remainder of a term to which a member was appointed to fill a vacancy, two additional terms may be served by such member if appointed thereto. 31 32 C. The voting members of the Board shall elect a chairman and vice-chairman annually from among 33 its membership. A majority of the members of the Board shall constitute a quorum. The Board shall 34 meet no more than six times per year. The meetings of the Board shall be held at the call of the 35 chairman or whenever the majority of the members so request. 36 § 2.2-2480. Compensation; expenses. 37 Members shall receive no compensation for their services. However, all members shall be reimbursed 38 for all reasonable and necessary expenses incurred in the performance of their duties as provided in 39 §§ 2.2-2813 and 2.2-2825. Funding for the costs of compensation and expenses of the members shall be 40 provided by the Department of Social Services in accordance with federal law. 41 § 2.2-2481. Powers and duties of the Board. 42 The Board shall have the power and duty to: 1. Advise the Governor, the Secretaries of Health and Human Resources, Education, and Natural 43 Resources, the Assistant to the Governor for Commonwealth Preparedness, the State Board of Social 44 45 Services, and other appropriate officials on national and community service programs in Virginia in order to (i) fulfill the responsibilities and duties prescribed by the federal Corporation for National and 46 47 Community Service and (ii) develop, implement, and evaluate the Virginia State Service Plan, which **48** outlines strategies for supporting and expanding national and community service throughout the 49 Commonwealth. 50 2. Promote the use of AmeriCorps programs to meet Virginia's most pressing human, educational, 51 environmental, and public safety needs. 3. Collaborate with the Department of Social Services and other public and private entities to 52 53 recognize and call attention to the significant community service contributions of Virginia citizens and 54 organizations. 55 4. Assist the Department of Social Services to promote the involvement of faith-based organizations 56 in community and national service efforts. 57 5. Submit an annual report to the Governor and the General Assembly for publication as a report document as provided in the procedures of the Division of Legislative Automated Systems for the 58

processing of legislative documents and reports. The chairman of the Board shall submit to the

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60 Governor and the General Assembly an annual executive summary of the interim activity and work of

61 the Board no later than the first day of each regular session of the General Assembly. The executive 62 summary shall be submitted for publication as a report document as provided in the procedures of the

63 Division of Legislative Automated Systems for the processing of legislative documents and reports and

64 shall be posted on the General Assembly's website.

65 § 2.2-2482. Staffing.

66 The Department of Social Services and any other executive branch agencies as the Governor may 67 designate shall serve as staff to the Board. All agencies of the Commonwealth shall assist the Board 68 upon request.

69 § 2.2-2483. Sunset.

This article shall expire on July 1, 2018.

71 2. That the initial appointments of the nonlegislative citizen members to the Advisory Board on

72 Service and Volunteerism shall be staggered as follows: seven nonlegislative citizen members

73 appointed for initial terms of one year, six nonlegislative citizen members appointed for initial 74 terms of two years, and seven nonlegislative citizen members appointed for initial terms of three

75 years.

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
