4	A BILL to amend and reenact § 46.2-924 of the Code of Virginia, relating to pedestrians crossing
5	highways.

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10	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
11	1. That § 46.2-924 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:
12	§ 46.2-924. Drivers to stop for pedestrians; installation of certain signs; penalty.
13 14	A. For the purposes of this section:
14	"Marked crosswalk" means any portion of a roadway, at an intersection or elsewhere, distinctly indicated for pedestrian crossing by lines or other markings on the highway surface.
16	"One-half of the highway" means all traffic lanes carrying traffic in one direction of travel and
<b>17</b>	includes the entire width of a one-way highway.
18	B. The driver of any vehicle on a highway shall yield the right-of-way to any pedestrian crossing
19	such highway:
20	1. At any clearly marked crosswalk, whether at mid-block or at the end of any block when the
21 22	pedestrian is upon or within one-half of the highway on which the vehicle is traveling where the legal
22 23	<ul><li>maximum speed limit is more than 35 miles per hour;</li><li>2. At any regular pedestrian crossing included in the prolongation of the lateral boundary lines of the</li></ul>
24 24	adjacent sidewalk at the end of a block; and
25	3. At any intersection when the driver is approaching on a highway or street where the legal
26	maximum speed does not exceed limit is no more than 35 miles per hour.
27	B. C. The driver of any vehicle on a highway shall stop and remain stopped to allow a pedestrian to
28	cross a highway within a marked crosswalk when the pedestrian is upon or within one-half of the
29 30	highway on which the vehicle is traveling where the legal maximum speed limit is no more than 35 miles per hour.
31	D. Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection A subsections B and C, at intersections or
32	crosswalks where the movement of traffic is being regulated by law-enforcement officers or traffic
33	control devices, the driver shall yield according to the direction of the law-enforcement officer or device.
34	No pedestrian shall enter or cross an intersection in disregard of approaching traffic.
35	The drivers of vehicles entering, crossing, or turning at intersections shall change their course, slow
36 37	down, or stop if necessary to permit pedestrians to cross such intersections safely and expeditiously. Pedestrians crossing highways at intersections shall at all times have the right-of-way over vehicles
37 38	making turns into the highways being crossed by the pedestrians.
<b>39</b>	C. E. The governing body of Arlington County, Fairfax County, Loudoun County and any town
40	therein, the City of Alexandria, the City of Fairfax, and the City of Falls Church may by ordinance
41	provide for the installation and maintenance of highway signs at marked crosswalks specifically
42	requiring operators of motor vehicles, at the locations where such signs are installed, to (i) yield the
43	right-of-way to pedestrians crossing or attempting to cross the highway pursuant to subdivision B 1 or
44 45	( <i>ii</i> ) stop for pedestrians crossing or attempting to cross the highway pursuant to subsection C. Any operator of a motor vehicle who fails at such locations to yield the right-of-way to pedestrians as
46	required by obey such signs shall be is guilty of a traffic infraction punishable by a fine of no less than
47	\$100 or more than \$500. The Department of Transportation shall develop criteria for the design,
48	location, and installation of such signs. The provisions of this section shall not apply to any limited
49	access highway.
50 51	<b>D.</b> F. Where a shared-use path crosses a highway at a <del>clearly</del> marked crosswalk and there are no traffic control circula at such crossing the local covering holds may be endinged require reductions.
51 52	traffic control signals at such crossing, the local governing body may by ordinance require pedestrians, cyclists, and any other users of such shared-used path to come to a complete stop prior to entering such
52 53	crosswalk. Such local ordinance may provide for a fine not to exceed \$100 for violations. Any locality
54	adopting such an ordinance shall install and maintain stop signs, consistent with standards adopted by
55	the Commonwealth Transportation Board and to the extent necessary in coordination with the
56	Department of Transportation. At such crosswalks, no user of such shared-use path shall enter the
57	crosswalk in disregard of approaching traffic.

58 E. G. A locality adopting an ordinance under subsection  $\mathbf{D}$  F shall coordinate the enforcement and

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- placement of any stop signs affecting a shared-use path owned and operated by a park authority formed under Chapter 57 (§ 15.2-5700 et seq.) of Title 15.2 with such authority. 59 60
