6 WHEREAS, on December 31, 2014, Charles Majors, a respected businessman and community leader
7 in Danville, retired as president and chief executive officer of American National Bank after more than
8 two decades of service; and

9 WHEREAS, a native of Georgia, Charles Majors settled in Danville and practiced corporate and
10 commercial real estate law for 20 years, establishing a strong relationship with American National Bank
11 as the bank's counsel and a member of the board; and

 leadership as non-executive chair of American National Bank, and he will seek new opportunities to
