WHEREAS, Clarence Harvey Byler of Virginia Beach, who developed the city's Larkspur
neighborhood and other residential and commercial projects, a proud veteran of the United States

Khedive Temple Lodge; he had served as captain of the motor patrol and was president and a longtime
member of the International Association of Shrine Motor Corps; and
