WHEREAS, Dot Tolbert was active in local politics and belonged to the Newport News Republican City Committee; she also was a member of the Virginia Peninsula Unit of Parliamentarians; and

WHEREAS, for more than 50 years, Dot Tolbert belonged to the Verizon Peninsula TelecomPioneers and served as an officer and board member; she also greatly contributed to many other local civic organizations; and

WHEREAS, Dot Tolbert's many friends remember her kindness and generosity—especially her warm smile; she was a woman of faith and belonged to Temple Baptist Church for 58 years, where she taught Sunday school; and
