2 3 4 5 6 A BILL to examine approaches to ensure that chemical storage is conducted in a manner that protects 7 human health and the environment. 8

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

9 1. § 1. The Director of the Department of Environmental Quality, the State Health Commissioner, and the State Coordinator of Emergency Management shall evaluate existing statutory and regulatory tools 10 for ensuring that chemical storage in the Commonwealth is conducted in a manner that is protective of 11 human health, public safety, drinking water resources, and the environment of the Commonwealth. This 12 evaluation may include (i) an examination of Virginia's existing programs to protect drinking water 13 14 resources from contamination from chemical storage; (ii) identification of any existing gaps or inadequacy in drinking water protections related to chemical storage; (iii) identification of any existing 15 16 gaps or inadequacy in chemical storage standards; (iv) any recommendations on chemical storage in the 17 Commonwealth to address protection of human health, public safety, drinking water resources, the environment, and the economy of the Commonwealth; and (v) other policies and procedures that the 18 Director of the Department of Environmental Quality, the State Health Commissioner, and the State 19 20 Coordinator of Emergency Management determine may enhance the protection of Virginia's drinking 21 water resources and the safe storage of chemicals in Virginia. The Director of the Department of Environmental Quality, the State Health Commissioner, and the 22 23 State Coordinator of Emergency Management shall report the findings of the evaluation to the State 24 Water Commission, the Chairman of the Senate Committee on Agriculture, Conservation and Natural

- Resources, and the Chairman of the House Committee on Agriculture, Chesapeake and Natural 25 26 Resources no later than December 1, 2016.
- 27 For purposes of this section, "chemical storage" means those chemicals identified by the Superfund 28 Amendments and Reauthorization Act (SARA) and the Emergency Planning and Community
- 29 Right-To-Know Act (EPCRA) that provides for hazardous chemical storage reporting requirements in
- 30 Section 312 of the SARA and are stored in excess of 10,000 gallons.
- 2. That the provisions of this act shall expire on January 1, 2017. 31

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
