15105104D **SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 268** 1 2 AMENDMENT IN THE NATURE OF A SUBSTITUTE 3 (Proposed by the House Committee on Rules 4 on February 13, 2015) 5 (Patron Prior to Substitute—Senator Hanger) 6 Directing the Joint Legislative Audit and Review Commission to study the Commonwealth's Medicaid 7 program. Report. 8 WHEREAS, the Commonwealth's program of medical assistance services, also known as the 9 Medicaid program, is the largest program in the Commonwealth's budget, accounting for more than \$8 10 billion in combined state and federal funds in Fiscal Year 2014; and WHEREAS, state and federal appropriations for the Medicaid program have increased by 85 percent 11 over the past decade, and more than 1.1 million Virginians are now enrolled in the program; and 12 WHEREAS, elderly Virginians and Virginians with disabilities represent a minority of enrollees in 13 14 the Medicaid program but account for the majority of expenditures for medical assistance services and 15 generally receive services through a fee-for-service rather than a managed care system; and WHEREAS, the Commonwealth's Medicaid program has become increasingly complex as coverage 16 has expanded to include services related to long-term care, behavioral health, and developmental 17 18 disabilities; and 19 WHEREAS, no comprehensive and analytical review of the effectiveness and efficiency of the 20 Commonwealth's Medicaid program has been undertaken; and WHEREAS, in light of budgetary pressures facing states across the nation, promising models of care 21 22 and administrative processes have been implemented to lower costs associated with medical assistance 23 services while maintaining and improving patient outcomes; now, therefore, be it 24 RESOLVED by the Senate, the House of Delegates concurring, That the Joint Legislative Audit and 25 Review Commission be directed to study the Commonwealth's Medicaid program. In conducting its study, the Joint Legislative Audit and Review Commission shall (i) analyze the impact of major cost 26 27 drivers on the growth of Medicaid program expenditures, including eligibility; (ii) identify highest-cost 28 Medicaid recipients and services and assess whether opportunities exist to improve the cost-effectiveness 29 of health care delivery; (iii) examine the efficiency of the administration of the Commonwealth's 30 Medicaid program, including financial processes and controls, the recovery of third-party payments, eligibility processing, and review the implementation status of recommendations made in its 2011 report, 31 32 Mitigating the Risk of Improper Payments in the Virginia Medicaid Program, on improper payments and other reports related to improving efficiency and cost-effectiveness; (iv) identify evidence-based practices 33 34 and strategies that have been successfully adopted in other states and that could be used in the 35 Commonwealth to provide cost-effective care, strengthen patient outcomes, and maximize the efficiency 36 and integrity of internal processes; and (v) review other relevant issues and make recommendations as 37 appropriate. 38 Technical assistance shall be provided to the Joint Legislative Audit and Review Commission by the 39 Department of Medical Assistance Services. All agencies of the Commonwealth shall provide assistance 40 to the Joint Legislative Audit and Review Commission for this study, upon request. 41 The Joint Legislative Audit and Review Commission shall complete its meetings for the first year by 42 November 30, 2015, and for the second year by November 30, 2016, and the chairman shall submit to the Division of Legislative Automated Systems an executive summary of its findings and 43 recommendations no later than the first day of the next Regular Session of the General Assembly for 44 each year. Each executive summary shall state whether the Joint Legislative Audit and Review 45 Commission intends to submit to the General Assembly and the Governor a report of its findings and 46 recommendations for publication as a House or Senate document. The executive summaries and reports 47

shall be submitted as provided in the procedures of the Division of Legislative Automated Systems for

49 the processing of legislative documents and reports and shall be posted on the General Assembly's 50 website.

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
