3. Committee: Education

4. Title: Higher educational institution; prohibition on regulating concealed handguns.

5. Summary: Prohibits any public institution of higher education from adopting or enforcing any rule, regulation, or policy prohibiting or limiting the carrying of a concealed handgun on property owned or operated by the institution by any person entitled to carry a concealed handgun. The bill also provides that any rule, regulation, or policy adopted prior to July 1, 2015, prohibiting or limiting the carrying of a concealed handgun is invalid.

6. Budget Amendment Necessary: No.

7. Fiscal Impact Estimates: Preliminary, see item 8.

8. Fiscal Implications: It is anticipated that any administrative costs incurred by higher education institutions in administering provisions of this legislation can be absorbed within existing resources.

9. Specific Agency or Political Subdivisions Affected: All public colleges and universities.

10. Technical Amendment Necessary: No.

11. Other Comments: This bill is similar to HB1411, except that HB1411 prohibits the higher education institutions from restricting the carrying of concealed handgun by just full-time faculty.
