4. Title: School service providers; student personal information.

5. Summary: The proposed legislation would require school service providers that operate certain websites, mobile applications, or online services to maintain certain protections for such information, including transparency, privacy policies, information security programs, and access to an individual student's person information by the student and his parents. The provisions would be in addition to the federal Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) as well as existing state laws.

8. Fiscal Implications: The bill would require school service providers to take certain actions to protect student and teacher information. The bill will not impact state finances. It cannot determine if the provisions of the bill will impact local school division finances.
