**4. Title:** Competitive foods; school-sponsored fundraisers.

**5. Summary:** The proposed legislation would require the regulations setting nutritional guidelines for competitive foods to permit each public school a specified number of fundraisers, during which food other than competitive food may be sold to students.

**6. Budget Amendment Necessary:** None.

**7. Fiscal Impact Estimates:** Preliminary. See Item 8.

**8. Fiscal Implications:** Regulations limit what types of foods outside of the school breakfast and lunch program may be served to students. The proposed legislation would exempt food items sold through fundraisers. The bill is not expected to impact state finances. There could be a positive fiscal impact to school divisions resulting from the fundraisers, but any such impact cannot be determined at this time.
