4. Title: Registration of sex offenders

5. Summary:

Current law requires the Department of Corrections (DOC) to physically verify, within 30 days of the original registration and semiannually thereafter, the registration information of anyone registered as a sex offender and who is under the supervision of the department. Such information includes items such as home address and place of employment.

The proposed legislation would authorize the department, instead of physically verifying the information itself, to cause the Department of State Police to physically verify it.

8. Fiscal Implications:

The proposed legislation is not expected to have any fiscal impact. The Department of State Police already has the responsibility of verifying the information of sex offender registrants not under the supervision of the Department of Corrections and, thus has trained staff who now perform this function, should DOC need assistance.
