4. Title: Restoration of right to bear firearms

5. Summary:

Current law prohibits any person convicted of a felony from possessing or transporting a firearm, ammunition, stun gun, or explosive material. The law applies to persons convicted in other states as well as the Commonwealth. The prohibition does not apply to any person who has been pardoned or otherwise had his political disabilities, resulting from a felony conviction, removed.

The proposed legislation would expand the exemption to include persons whose right to possess firearms or ammunition has been restored under the law of another state, subject to any conditions placed upon the reinstatement by such state.
