**4. Title:** General Assembly; consideration of the conference committee report on the biennial budget.

**5. Summary:** General Assembly; consideration of the conference committee report on the biennial budget or general appropriation act. Provides that no legislative action shall be taken on the conference committee report on the biennial budget or the general appropriation act until the conference committee report has been reviewed by the members of the House of Delegates, the Senate of Virginia, and the citizens of Virginia for not less than five consecutive legislative days.

**6. Budget Amendment Necessary:** No.

**7. Fiscal Impact Estimates:** Indeterminate.

**8. Fiscal Implications:** The bill is policy in nature, and no significant fiscal impact is expected. However, the General Assembly currently posts the documents mentioned above on its Web site on the day of their initial release. In order to allow not less than five consecutive legislative days of review, additional costs may be incurred if the five consecutive legislative days review period results in a need to extend the session beyond the scheduled sine die. Per Diem costs for each General Assembly member would be incurred for each day the session is extended. Additionally, mileage reimbursement costs would be incurred if the House and Senate were to have a break of any kind during the extension that allowed the members to travel home.

**9. Specific Agency or Political Subdivisions Affected:** The General Assembly and the Division of Legislative Automated Systems.

**10. Technical Amendment Necessary:** No.

**11. Other Comments:** The bill is similar to House Bill 2076 and Senate Bill 1352.
