4. Title: Criminal street gang reporting

5. Summary:

When a state or local law-enforcement or correctional agency determines that a person is a member of a criminal street gang, as that term is defined by the Code of Virginia, the agency is required by law to enter, as soon as practicable, the person's name and other appropriate gang-related information into the Organized Criminal Gang File of the Virginia Criminal Information Network, maintained by the Department of State Police. The proposed legislation would provide an exception to the timing of the entry of the information into the gang file. In the case of a person incarcerated in the Department of Corrections whose period of incarceration exceeded one year, the entry could be made at any time prior to the person's release from incarceration.

8. Fiscal Implications:

Delaying the entry of the name of incarcerated persons into the gang file maintained by the State Police is not expected to have a fiscal impact on any agencies involved.
