4. Title: Certificate of public need; eliminates regional health planning agencies and adds an exception

5. Summary: The enrolled bill amends the definition of "project" for which a certificate of public need is required to include capital expenditures of \$15 million or more by or on behalf of a medical care facility other than a general hospital. Currently, all capital expenditures of \$15 million or more by any medical care facility constitute a project for which a certificate of public need (COPN) is required. The bill provides that capital expenditures of \$5 million or more by a general hospital shall be registered with the Commissioner of Health. The bill also directs the Secretary of Health and Human Resources (OSHHR) to convene a workgroup to review the current certificate of public need process and its impact on health care services in the Commonwealth, and the need for changes to the current certificate of public need process.

7. Minimal Fiscal Impact

8. Fiscal Implications: It is assumed that the OSHHR could convene the workgroup, as required by the bill, with existing resources. However, the scope of the evaluations called for in the bill would be limited to the input gained from relevant state employees and participating stakeholders. The OSHHR maintains that a more thorough and comprehensive evaluation of the COPN would require additional funding to procure outside expertise and analytics.
