3. Committee: Passed both houses

4. Title: Public elementary and secondary schools; student identification numbers.

5. Summary: The proposed legislation would prohibit the Department of Education (DOE) and any local school board to require any student enrolled in a public elementary or secondary school or receiving home instruction or his parent to provide the student's federal social security number. The bill requires the Department to instead develop a system of unique student identification numbers and requires each local school board to assign such a number to each student enrolled in a public elementary or secondary school. The student is to retain the identification number for as long as he is enrolled in a public school. The bill has an effective date of August 1, 2015.

6. Budget Amendment Necessary: None.

7. Fiscal Impact Estimates: Final. See Item 8.

8. Fiscal Implications: DOE has already developed a system of unique state testing identifiers (STI) which the local school divisions use for each student. The STI is a ten-digit number which is assigned to all students in K-12 and to any pre-school students enrolled in special education and stays with the student throughout his or her K-12 public school education. The proposed legislation does not have any anticipated state fiscal impact

There may be a fiscal impact to school divisions to implement an alternate identification system. Based on a survey conducted by DOE, 13 out of 96 responding school divisions use social security numbers as identifiers. One division uses a derivative of the social security number as an identifier. Any local fiscal impact cannot be determined at this time.
