3. Committee: Privileges and Elections

4. Title: Voter registration; voter list maintenance.

5. Summary: Extends the current prohibition against periodic list maintenance within the 90 days preceding a federal primary or general election to all primary and general elections. The bill also requires that the processing of registered voter lists developed through list comparisons with other states is to be completed in accordance with the current laws for regular periodic list maintenance.

8. Fiscal Implications: According to the Department of Elections, this bill would not have a state fiscal impact. The existing list maintenance activities would be consolidated into a single program using the same procedures and communications to voters; therefore; additional costs are not expected to be incurred by the agency. It is expected that the consolidation of existing list maintenance activities may result in some efficiency for both state and local election officials over time.
