5. Summary:

The proposed legislation would authorize the director of the Department of Corrections, any sheriff, or other official in charge of a facility in which an alien is incarcerated, upon receipt of a detainer, to transfer the alien to the U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement up to five days before the time he or she would have otherwise been released from custody. The alien would receive credit toward his state sentence for the number of days remaining until he otherwise would have been released.
