3. Committee: Courts of Justice

4. Title: Firearms; criminal history record information check on transferee; penalties.

5. Summary: The proposed legislation adds a definition of "firearms show vendor" and requires that a criminal history record information check be performed on the prospective transferee before the vendor may transfer firearms at a gun show. In order to be a "firearms show vendor" the person must have paid or given other thing of value to the promoter for the opportunity to sell guns at the gun show. Under current law, only licensed dealers must obtain such a check. The bill also requires that the promoter of a firearms show provide vendors access to licensed dealers who will conduct the criminal history record information check.

Fiscal Implications: According to the Virginia Criminal Sentencing Commission's fiscal impact statement for the proposed legislation, the impact of the legislation on state-responsible (prison) space cannot be determined. In such cases, Chapter 806 of the 2013 Acts of Assembly requires that a minimum impact of \$50,000 be assigned to the bill. According to the Department of State Police (Department), the proposal has no fiscal impact on the Department.
