4. Title: Seizure of property; receipt required.

5. Summary: The legislative proposal requires the agency seizing property to issue contemporaneously with the seizure, a receipt itemizing the property seized.

8. Fiscal Implications: The substitute provides that when any property is seized for the purposes of forfeiture under Chapter 22.2 (§ 19.2-386.15 et seq.) or other forfeiture provision under the Code, the agency seizing the property shall within three days after the seizure provide the person from whom the property was seized a receipt itemizing the property seized. Saturdays, Sundays, or any federal or state legal holiday shall not be counted in computing the three-day period. Failure to comply with the provisions of this subsection shall not invalidate any forfeiture.

The introduced bill provided that a law enforcement agency seizing the property shall, contemporaneously with the seizure, provide the person from whom the property is seized a receipt itemizing the property seized.

The bill has no material impact on the Department of State Police.
