4. Title: Juvenile law-enforcement records; restorative justice.

5. Summary: Juvenile law-enforcement records; restorative justice. Allows entities who have a contract with a juvenile and domestic relations district court to provide restorative justice services to inspect the police records of juveniles who are participating in the program or who have been identified by law-enforcement as possible participants.

8. Fiscal Implications: The legislation has no material impact on state agencies, including Virginia Department of Juvenile Justice and Virginia State Police. Under the proposed legislation, entities that have a contract with a local governing body or court services unit to provide restorative justice services will be allowed to inspect the records of juveniles who are participating in the program or who have been identified by law-enforcement as possible participants.
