**4. Title:** Water Protection and Toxic Chemicals Advisory Committee; established, report, sunset provision.

**5. Summary:** Directs the Director of the Department of Environmental Quality, the State Health Commissioner, and the State Coordinator of Emergency Management to evaluate and report existing statutory and regulatory tools for ensuring that chemical storage is conducted in a manner that is protective of human health, public safety, drinking water resources, and the environment. The Director, Commissioner, and the State Coordinator shall report the findings of the evaluation to the State Water Commission, the Chairman of the Senate Committee on Agriculture, Conservation and Natural Resources, and the Chairman of the House Committee on Agriculture, Chesapeake and Natural Resources no later than December 1, 2016. The provisions of this act shall expire on January 1, 2017.
