10 11	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia: 1. That the Code of Virginia is amended by adding a section numbered 8.01-40.4 as follows:
12	§ 8.01-40.4. Invasion of privacy; civil action.
13	A. Any person who without lawful authority enters onto the land or uses an unmanned aircraft
14	system, as defined in § 19.2-60.1, to enter into the airspace above the land of another person to capture
15	or attempt to capture an image, including the capture of a visual image, sound waves, or thermal,
16	infrared, ultraviolet, or visible light waves or other electromagnetic waves, of private property or an
17	individual located on such private property without the consent of the landowner or other person
18	lawfully in charge of such property is liable for physical invasion of privacy.
19	B. Any person without lawful authority who uses any device, including an unmanned aircraft system
20	as defined in § 19.2-60.1, to capture or attempt to capture an image, including the capture of a visual
21	image, sound waves, or thermal, infrared, ultraviolet, or visible light waves or other electromagnetic
22	waves, of private property or an individual located on such private property without the consent of the
23	landowner or other person lawfully in charge of such property is liable for constructive invasion of
24	privacy, regardless of whether there is physical entry onto the land or into the airspace above the land
25	of another person, if such image could not have been obtained without such physical entry unless the
26	device was used.

27 28 29 C. Any person found in violation of this section shall be liable to the plaintiff for actual damages or \$1,000, whichever is greater, in addition to reasonable attorney fees and costs.

D. If actual damages are awarded, the court may, in its discretion, award punitive damages.
