That § 51.5-33 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows: § 51.5-33. Powers and duties.</li> <li>The Board shall have the following powers and duties:</li> <li>1. To advise the Secretary of Health and Human Resources and Governor on issues and problems of interest to persons with disabilities and on such other matters as either the Secretary or the Governor may request;</li> <li>2. Fo Beginning July 1, 2017, to submit every three years an annual report to the Governor, through the Secretary of Health and Human Resources, that provides an in-depth assessment of the needs of persons at least two major service areas for people with disabilities in the Commonwealth, the success in the preceding three years of the state agencies to persons with disabilities, and an assessment of the triennial economic cost and benefit to the Commonwealth of the services and rights afforded persons with disabilities as established in this title, to be determined by the Board, that (i) includes a description of critical issues and thred analyses, (ii) identifies the needs of persons with divelopmental and related disabilities, (iii) evaluates the effectiveness of services provided by state-supported programs, and (iv) makes programmatic and fiscal recommendations for improving thered and each of the eight major service areas is reviewed at least one time every four years ];</li> <li>3.
