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10	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
11	1. That § 22.1-298.1 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted and that the Code of
12	Virginia is amended by adding a section numbered 22.1-298.4 as follows:
13	§ 22.1-298.1. Regulations governing licensure.
14	A. As used in this section:
15	"Alternate route to licensure" means a nontraditional route to teacher licensure available to
16	individuals who meet the criteria specified in the regulations issued by the Board of Education.
17	"Industry certification credential" means an active career and technical education credential that is
18	earned by successfully completing a Board of Education-approved industry certification examination,
19 20	being issued a professional license in the Commonwealth, or successfully completing an occupational competency examination.
20 21	"Licensure by reciprocity" means a process used to issue a license to an individual coming into the
$\frac{21}{22}$	Commonwealth from another state when that individual meets certain conditions specified in the Board
$\bar{23}$	of Education's regulations.
24	"Professional teacher's assessment" means those tests mandated for licensure as prescribed by the
25	Board of Education.
26	"Provisional license" means a nonrenewable license issued by the Board of Education for a specified
27	period of time, not to exceed three years, to an individual who may be employed by a school division in
28	the Commonwealth and who generally meets the requirements specified in the Board of Education's
29 20	regulations for licensure, but who may need to take additional coursework or pass additional assessments
30 31	to be fully licensed with a renewable license. "Renewable license" means a license issued by the Board of Education for five years to an individual
32	who meets the requirements specified in the Board of Education's regulations.
33	B. The Board of Education shall prescribe, by regulation, the requirements for the licensure of
34	teachers and other school personnel required to hold a license. Such regulations shall include
35	requirements for the denial, suspension, cancellation, revocation, and reinstatement of licensure. The
36	Board of Education shall revoke the license of any person for whom it has received a notice of
37	dismissal or resignation pursuant to subsection F of § 22.1-313 and, in the case of a person who is the
	subject of a founded complaint of child abuse or neglect, after all rights to any appeal provided by
39 40	§ 63.2-1526 have been exhausted. Regardless of the authority of any other agency of the Commonwealth
40 41	to approve educational programs, only the Board of Education shall have the authority to license teachers to be regularly employed by school boards, including those teachers employed to provide
42	nursing education.
43	The Board of Education shall prescribe by regulation the licensure requirements for teachers who
44	teach only online courses, as defined in § 22.1-212.23. Such license shall be valid only for teaching
45	online courses. Teachers who hold a five-year renewable license issued by the Board of Education may
46	teach online courses for which they are properly endorsed.
47	C. The Board of Education's regulations shall include requirements that a person seeking initial
48	licensure:
49 50	 Complete professional assessments as prescribed by the Board of Education; Complete study in attention deficit disorder;
50 51	3. Complete study in gifted education, including the use of multiple criteria to identify gifted
51 52	students; and
53	4. Complete study in methods of improving communication between schools and families and ways
54	of increasing family involvement in student learning at home and at school.
55	D. In addition, such regulations shall include requirements that:
56	1. Every person seeking initial licensure or renewal of a license demonstrate proficiency in the use of
57	educational technology for instruction;

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58 2. Every person seeking initial licensure and persons seeking licensure renewal as teachers who have 59 not completed such study shall complete study in child abuse recognition and intervention in accordance 60 with curriculum guidelines developed by the Board of Education in consultation with the Department of 61 Social Services that are relevant to the specific teacher licensure routes;

62 3. Every person seeking initial licensure or renewal of a license shall receive professional 63 development in instructional methods tailored to promote student academic progress and effective 64 preparation for the Standards of Learning end-of-course and end-of-grade assessments;

4. Every person seeking renewal of a license shall complete all renewal requirements, including 65 professional development in a manner prescribed by the Board, except that no person seeking renewal of 66 a license shall be required to satisfy any such requirement by completing coursework and earning credit 67 68 at an institution of higher education;

5. Every person seeking initial licensure or renewal of a license shall provide evidence of completion 69 70 of certification or training in emergency first aid, cardiopulmonary resuscitation, and the use of automated external defibrillators. The certification or training program shall be based on the current 71 national evidence-based emergency cardiovascular care guidelines for cardiopulmonary resuscitation and 72 73 the use of an automated external defibrillator, such as a program developed by the American Heart Association or the American Red Cross. The Board shall provide a waiver for this requirement for any 74 75 person with a disability whose disability prohibits such person from completing the certification or 76 training;

77 6. Every person seeking licensure with an endorsement as a teacher of the blind and visually 78 impaired shall demonstrate proficiency in reading and writing Braille; and

79 7. Every teacher seeking an initial license in the Commonwealth with an endorsement in the area of 80 career and technical education shall have an industry certification credential in the area in which the teacher seeks endorsement. If a teacher seeking an initial license in the Commonwealth has not attained 81 82 an industry certification credential in the area in which the teacher seeks endorsement, the Board may, 83 upon request of the employing school division or educational agency, issue the teacher a provisional 84 license to allow time for the teacher to attain such credential; and

85 8. Every person seeking initial licensure or renewal of a license shall receive professional 86 development in the indicators of dyslexia, as that term is used by the Board pursuant to regulations, and 87 the scientific methods of teaching a student who is dyslexic.

88 E. The Board's regulations shall require that initial licensure for principals and assistant principals be 89 contingent upon passage of an assessment as prescribed by the Board.

90 F. The Board shall establish criteria in its regulations to effectuate the substitution of experiential 91 learning for coursework for those persons seeking initial licensure through an alternate route as defined 92 in Board regulations.

93 G. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, the Board may provide for the issuance of 94 a provisional license, valid for a period not to exceed three years, pursuant to subdivision D 7 or to any 95 person who does not meet the requirements of this section or any other requirement for licensure 96 imposed by law. 97

H. The Board's licensure regulations shall also provide for licensure by reciprocity:

98 1. With comparable endorsement areas for those individuals holding a valid out-of-state teaching 99 license and national certification from the National Board for Professional Teaching Standards or a 100 nationally recognized certification program approved by the Board of Education. The application for such individuals shall require evidence of such valid licensure and national certification and shall not 101 102 require official student transcripts;

2. For individuals who have obtained a valid out-of-state license, with full credentials and without 103 104 deficiencies, that is in force at the time the application for a Virginia license is received by the Department of Education. The individual must establish a file in the Department of Education by 105 106 submitting a complete application packet, which shall include official student transcripts. An assessment of basic skills as provided in § 22.1-298.2 and service requirements shall not be imposed for these 107 108 licensed individuals; however, other licensing assessments, as prescribed by the Board of Education, 109 shall be required; and 110

3. The Board may include other provisions for reciprocity in its regulations.

§ 22.1-298.4. Teacher preparation programs; dyslexia.

112 The Department of Education shall collaborate with the State Council of Higher Education for Virginia to ensure that all teacher preparation programs offered at public institutions of higher 113 114 education in the Commonwealth convey information on the identification of students at risk for dyslexia, 115 as that term is used by the Board pursuant to regulations, and related disorders.
