WHEREAS, this method of curing was an Indian tradition and English colonists adopted their method and passed it down to succeeding generations—Wallace Edwards, Sr., learned how to prepare country ham from his mother and father; and

WHEREAS, S. Wallace Edwards & Sons is run by Sam Edwards III, who is following in the footsteps of his father, Wallace Edwards, Jr., and his grandfather, Wallace Edwards, Sr., relying on their knowledge of curing meat and their insistence on business integrity and quality products; and

WHEREAS, S. Wallace Edwards & Sons continues to have family members and dedicated staff working to grow the business and maintain its goal of making the best possible products; now, therefore, be it
