WHEREAS, in addition to his work with the Waynesboro Police Department, Reo Hatfield is a successful businessman and a former elected city official; he is president of Reo Distribution in Waynesboro and he served two terms on the Waynesboro City Council; and

WHEREAS, Reo Hatfield encourages other people to become involved in community police work as a way of sharing and giving back; he cites the insights he gained from being out in the community and his recognition of the good that law enforcement professionals strive to do; and

WHEREAS, Reo Hatfield's son, Reo Hatfield III, is an officer with the Virginia Beach Police Department and is continuing his father's proud tradition of law enforcement service to the community and the Commonwealth; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the General Assembly hereby commend Reo Hatfield, the former chief of the Waynesboro Police Department Auxiliary Unit, for 25 years of work to protect and serve the people of Waynesboro; and, be it

RESOLVED FURTHER, That the Clerk of the House of Delegates prepare a copy of this resolution for presentation to Reo Hatfield as an expression of the General Assembly's respect and admiration for his many years of law enforcement work.
