 and patients for his compassion, medical expertise, and commitment to serving others; in 1981, he
 joined Neurological Associates in Richmond, where he practiced until his well-earned retirement in
 2013; and

19 WHEREAS, well known in the medical field, Jack Brush was a lifelong member of the Virginia20 Neurological Society, the Richmond Academy of Medicine, and the Medical Society of Virginia; and

WHEREAS, a loving husband, father, and grandfather, Jack Brush is fondly remembered and greatly
 missed by his wife of 45 years, Judy; children, Jack, Jr., Jeannie, and Billy, and their families; and
