6 WHEREAS, the Honorable Thomas Jack Bondurant, Sr., a respected attorney who served the 7 Lebanon community for many years and a retired judge of the 27th and 29th Judicial Districts of Virginia, died on February 20, 2016; and 8

WHEREAS, a native of Damascus, Jack Bondurant grew up in Elk Garden and learned the value of 9 10 hard work and responsibility at a young age while working on the Stuart Land and Cattle Company Farm: and 11

WHEREAS, Jack Bondurant graduated from Lebanon High School and attended Emory & Henry 12 13 College, before joining many of the other young men of his generation in service to the nation during World War II; he earned several awards and decorations for his valorous military service, including the 14 15 Bronze Star Medal and the Purple Heart; and

WHEREAS, after the war, Jack Bondurant finished his undergraduate degree at Emory & Henry 16 17 College and earned a law degree from the University of Richmond under the GI Bill; and

18 WHEREAS, Jack Bondurant returned to Lebanon, where he opened a solo legal practice, then started 19 a general practice firm with two other attorneys, offering nearly every legal service the members of the 20 rural community might need; and

21 WHEREAS, appointed as a judge of the 27th and 29th Judicial Districts of Virginia, Jack Bondurant presided with great fairness and wisdom over General District Courts in the Counties of Bland, Giles, 22 23 and Russell with great fairness and wisdom for many years; and

24 WHEREAS, after his well-earned retirement as a judge, Jack Bondurant lived near family members 25 in Salem and Atlanta, Georgia; he and his wife Peggy traveled to all 50 states, every province and territory in Canada, and countries throughout Central and South America, Europe, and North Africa; and 26 27 WHEREAS, a man of great integrity, Jack Bondurant served the community and the Commonwealth 28 with the utmost professionalism and dedication; and

29 WHEREAS, Jack Bondurant will be fondly remembered and greatly missed by his beloved wife, 30 Peggy; children, Betsy and Thomas, Jr., and their families; and numerous other family members and 31 friends; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED by the Senate, the House of Delegates concurring, That the General Assembly hereby 32 33 note with great sadness the loss of the Honorable Thomas Jack Bondurant, Sr., a respected attorney and 34 former judge of the 27th and 29th Judicial Districts of Virginia; and, be it
