4. Title: Issuance of certain special license plates

5. Summary: This bill prohibits the Department of Motor Vehicles from issuing to registered sex offenders special license plates of all four designs for supporters of the Family and Children's Trust Fund of Virginia or renewing the registration for a vehicle that has been issued such license plates.

6. Budget Amendment Necessary: No.

7. Fiscal Impact Estimates: Preliminary. See Item #8.

8. Fiscal Implications: This legislation would require the Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) to create notifications in electronic systems noting that individuals listed on the Sex Offender and Crimes Against Minors Registry are not eligible for certain license plates.

The necessary system modifications will cost approximately \$39,753 in information technology programming, which DMV can absorb within existing resources.
