3. Committee: Passed the House.

4. Title: Animal control officers; training.

5. Summary: This engrossed bill requires animal control officers hired on or after July 1, 2017, to complete a basic animal control course within one year after the date of hire or within two years if the officer is attending a law enforcement academy. Current law requires completion of such training course within two years after the date of hire.

6. Budget Amendment Necessary: No.

7. Fiscal Impact Estimates: Preliminary.

8. Fiscal Implications: It is anticipated that this bill will not result in a fiscal impact to the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services.
