4. Title: Establish a civil penalty for smoking in a motor vehicle with a minor present

5. Summary: This bill provides that any person who smokes in a motor vehicle, whether in motion or at rest, when a minor under the age of eight is in the motor vehicle, is subject to a civil penalty of \$100, but no demerit points or court costs. The offense may be charged on a uniform traffic summons. No citation may be issued unless the officer stops or arrests the driver for the violation of another state or local traffic offense.

8. Fiscal Implications: There is insufficient information available to reliably estimate how many violations could result from this proposed legislation. However, resulting fines would be deposited into the Literary Fund.
