4. Title: Photo identification cards issued by Department of Criminal Justice Services

5. Summary:

The proposed legislation would require the Department of Criminal Justice Services (DCJS) to issue photo-identification cards to all private security services personnel regulated by DCJS, special conservators of the peace, bail bondsmen, and bail enforcement agents. All these groups are required to be regulated by the department and the photo-identification card would be issued upon each individual's initial or renewal application for registration or license.

The legislation authorizes the DCJS to charge a fee for each card issued or reissued equal to the fee charged by the Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) for the issuance of a special identification card, currently \$10.00. (§ 46.2-345, Code of Virginia, establishes a basic fee of \$5.00 for special id cards; § 46.2-333.1, Code of Virginia, provides for an additional surcharge of \$5.00 for such cards.) For cards issued between July 1, 2017 and June 30, 2018, the agency would be authorized to charge an additional \$4.00 processing fee.

Finally, the legislation would authorize DCJS to enter into an agreement with DMV to create and produce the photo-identification cards to be issued by DCJS. DMV would be authorized to charge DCJS a fee for each card produced equal to the fee DMV may charge for the issuance of a special identification card. In addition, DMV would charge DCJS a processing fee of \$4.00 for each card issued or reissued between July 1, 2016 and June 30, 2017. All such fees collected by DMV would be set aside in a special fund to meet the expenses of DMV.

The proposed legislation would be effective July 1, 2017.

8. Fiscal Implications:

It is expected that the fees authorized by the proposed legislation would offset the expenses of producing and issuing the photo-identification cards. Therefore, there would be no net fiscal impact resulting from the legislation.
