4. Title: Anatomical gifts; human remains detection dog training.

5. Summary: The bill requires the Department of Health to convene a workgroup of key stakeholders to study the use of human remains donated to search and rescue organizations as anatomical gifts for the purpose of training dogs to find human remains during search and rescue operations, and to establish policies to govern the process of using anatomical gifts for that purpose. The work group shall report its activities, findings, and recommendations to the General Assembly by December 1, 2016.
