3. Committee: Passed Both Houses.

4. Title: Allowing the sale of wildlife products.

5. Summary: This bill authorizes the Board of Game and Inland Fisheries to adopt regulations that allow a licensed hunter or trapper to manufacture and sell products made from wildlife that he has legally taken, except where the Board determines that such manufacture or sale is detrimental to public health or sound wildlife management. The bill also allows the use or transportation of turkey feathers and toes taken from legally harvested turkey carcasses for the purposes of making tools or utensils or selling such tools or utensils.

7. Fiscal Impact Estimates: Final.

8. Fiscal Implications: It is anticipated that any costs associated with the development of regulations can be absorbed in current resources by the Department of Game and Inland Fisheries. At this time, it is uncertain if the regulations developed will result in the creation of a permit.
