4. Title: Immigration detainers

5. Summary:

The proposed legislation would require the Director, Department of Corrections, sheriff, or any regional jail superintendent in which an alien is incarcerated to comply with any detainer received from U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement. Any alien subject to a detainer shall not be released except to transfer custody to another facility or to U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement. However, no alien may be held in custody beyond the date upon which he ordinarily would have been released.

The legislation provides that, if an alien is released in violation of this requirement, the Commonwealth, in the case of the Department of Corrections (DOC) or the locality or localities, in case of jails, would be liable for any tortious injury or act committed by the alien after his release. The legislation would constitute a specific waiver of sovereign immunity.

8. Fiscal Implications:

According to DOC, it is their policy to comply with any federal detainer; therefore, the proposed legislation would not have any impact on the agency.

The proposed legislation could have a fiscal impact on the state or localities if any correctional official failed to comply with a federal detainer, intentionally or not, and the state or locality subsequently was liable for injuries or damages committed by the alien after his release. However, it is not feasible to project the probability or magnitude of such fiscal impact.
