**5. Summary:** This bill provides that convictions for motor vehicle offenses committed on a federal reservation located within the Commonwealth shall be treated by the Commissioner of the Department of Motor Vehicles in the same manner as out-of-state convictions.

Fiscal Implications:** The Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) believes this legislation may be unnecessary, considering the current DMV practice, which is to post U.S. District Court convictions on an individual's driving record as soon as the agency receives notice from the U.S. District Courts.
