**4. Title: Barrier crimes**

**5. Summary:**

Under current law, convictions of specified offenses serve as a barrier to licensure as a child welfare agency or assisted living facility, approval as a foster or adoptive parent by a child-placing agency, approval as a family day home by a family day system, or employment or serving as a volunteer at an assisted living facility, adult day care center, or child welfare agency, or children's residential facility. The proposed legislation would add to the list any conviction for which the offender would be required to register with the Sex Offender and Crimes Against Minors Registry. It would also include any finding of not guilty by reason of insanity which resulted in a person having to register with such Registry.
