2. Patron: Carrico

3. Committee: Passed Both Houses

4. Title: General Services, Department of; animals trained for police work.

5. Summary: Replaces the term "dog" with "animal" in recognition that law-enforcement officers use not just dogs in their work, and provides that law-enforcement officers may purchase such animals for \$1. The bill also allows the immediate survivor of any full-time sworn law-enforcement officer who (i) is killed in the line of duty or (ii) dies in service and has at least 10 years of service to purchase the service animal at a price of \$1.

6. Budget Amendment Necessary: No.

7. Fiscal Impact Estimates: No state fiscal impact. See Item 8, below.

8. Fiscal Implications: No state fiscal impact is expected. The bill is permissive and allows state entities to sell animals trained for police work for \$1 to the animal's last handler or to the immediate survivor of a full-time sworn law-enforcement officer who (i) is killed in the line of duty or (ii) dies in service and has at least 10 years of service.

According to the Department of General Services, the Code of Virginia currently allows dogs to be sold for the price of \$1 and extending this to all animals trained for police work and purchases of such animals made by the immediate survivor of a law-enforcement officer is not expected to have a fiscal impact. The Department of State Police and Division of Capitol Police report that they currently allow handlers to purchase trained police dogs for \$1 when dogs are retired and the Division of Capitol Police extends the same opportunity to the family of an officer killed in the line of duty.

9. Specific Agency or Political Subdivisions Affected: The Department of General Services and any department, division, institution, or agency of the Commonwealth with animals trained for police work, including the Department of State Police, Division of Capitol Police, and the Department of Corrections.

10. Technical Amendment Necessary: No,

11. Other Comments: The enrolled version of SB38 is similar, but not identical to, HB1238, as engrossed by the House.
