Summary: The proposed legislation directs any public institution of higher education that awards medical degrees to require its medical students to participate in at least one clinical rotation in a hospital or clinic located in a medically underserved area that has an unemployment rate of one and one-half times the statewide average unemployment rate, or in a locality with a population of 50,000 or less in the Commonwealth as determined by the Virginia Department of Health.

Fiscal Implications:** According to representatives of the three medical schools, it could be costly to establish a clinical rotation for all students in a medically underserved area, with low high unemployment rates. With limited practitioners in underserved areas, it may be challenging to find willing providers to establish the required rotations to accommodate all medical students from the three medical schools.
