Summary: The proposal replaces current requirements that law-enforcement agencies report information regarding confiscated firearms to the Department of State Police with a requirement that information be reported to a firearms tracing system maintained by the U.S. Department of Justice. Additionally, the bill requires law-enforcement agencies to return stolen firearms to the rightful owner unless the person is prohibited from possessing the firearm or it is needed in a criminal prosecution.

In order to use the system, a venforcement agency must sign a memorandum of understanding with the Alcohol, Tobacco, tearms and Explosives' (ATF) National Tracing Center.
