4. Title: Out-of-state concealed handgun permits; photo identification.

5. Summary: The proposed legislation removes certain requirements for an out-of-state concealed handgun permit or license to be recognized and accepted in Virginia and instead requires an out-of-state permit or license holder to carry a government-issued photo identification and present his permit or license and such identification upon demand by a law-enforcement officer in order for his out-of-state permit or license to be recognized and accepted in Virginia.

7. Fiscal Impact Estimates: Preliminary. See Item 8.

8. Fiscal Implications: Under the proposed legislation, a person who holds an out-of-state permit or license is required to carry a photo identification issued by a government agency of any state or by the U.S. Department of Defense or U.S. Department of State and displays the permit or license and such identification upon demand by a law enforcement officer.

It is uncertain if the proposed legislation will impact the number of requests for non-resident concealed handgun permits issued in Virginia, and therefore, the potential impact on the general fund revenue cannot be determined. During the last three years, the Department of State Police (Department) issued 11,052 nonresident concealed handgun permits. The fee collected for such permits is \$100 per permit. Over the last three years \$1,105,200 was deposited in the general fund. According to the Department, the proposal has no direct material fiscal impact on the Department's operations.
