4. Title: Technical changes; registration exemptions

5. Summary: This bill clarifies that a person with a registration exemption is not required to obtain a registration certificate, license plates, or decals and makes the corresponding grammatical clarification throughout Article 6 (§ 46.2-662 et seq.) of Chapter 6 of Title 46.2.

6. Budget Amendment Necessary: No.

7. No fiscal impact. Final. See Item #8.

8. Fiscal Implications: This bill will have no impact on the Department of Motor Vehicles, as the agency does not currently require an owner to obtain the registration certificate, license plates, or decals for or pay any registration fee for any vehicle exempt from registration under the amended sections. This legislation simply clarifies existing law in order to ensure consistent understanding and interpretation of the exemptions.
