An Act to amend and reenact § 2.2-2101, as it is currently effective and as it shall become effective, of
the Code of Virginia and to amend the Code of Virginia by adding in Chapter 31 of Title 23.1 an
article numbered 9, consisting of sections numbered 23.1-3134 through 23.1-3137, relating to the
establishment of the Online Virginia Network Authority.

# Approved

8 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

9 1. That § 2.2-2101, as it is currently effective and as it shall become effective, of the Code of 10 Virginia is amended and reenacted and that the Code of Virginia is amended by adding in 11 Chapter 31 of Title 23.1 an article numbered 9, consisting of sections numbered 23.1-3134 through 12 23.1-3137, as follows:

\$ 2.2-2101. (Effective until July 1, 2017) Prohibition against service by legislators on boards,
 commissions, and councils within the executive branch; exceptions.

15 Members of the General Assembly shall be ineligible to serve on boards, commissions, and councils within the executive branch of state government who are responsible for administering programs 16 established by the General Assembly. Such prohibition shall not extend to boards, commissions, and 17 18 councils engaged solely in policy studies or commemorative activities. If any law directs the 19 appointment of any member of the General Assembly to a board, commission, or council in the executive branch of state government that is responsible for administering programs established by the 20 21 General Assembly, such portion of such law shall be void, and the Governor shall appoint another 22 person from the Commonwealth at large to fill such a position.

#### Article 9.

#### Online Virginia Network Authority.

### § 23.1-3134. Online Virginia Network Authority established.

87 The Online Virginia Network Authority (the Authority) is established as a political subdivision of the 88 Commonwealth for the purpose of providing a means for individuals to earn degrees and postsecondary 89 education credentials by improving the quality of and expanding access to online degree and credential 90 programs that are beneficial to citizens, public institutions of higher education, and employers in the 91 Commonwealth. 92

# § 23.1-3135. Board of Trustees.

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93 A. The Authority shall be governed by a Board of Trustees (the Board) that has a total membership 94 of 15 members that shall consist of four members of the House of Delegates to be appointed by the 95 Speaker of the House of Delegates in accordance with the principles of proportional representation 96 contained in the Rules of the House of Delegates; three members of the Senate to be appointed by the 97 Senate Committee on Rules; three nonlegislative citizen members to be appointed by the Governor; one 98 nonlegislative citizen member to be appointed by the board of visitors of George Mason University; one 99 nonlegislative citizen member to be appointed by the board of visitors of Old Dominion University; and 100 three members who shall serve ex officio with voting privileges, consisting of the President of George Mason University or his designee, the President of Old Dominion University or his designee, and the 101 102 Director of the Council. Nonlegislative citizen members of the Authority shall be citizens of the 103 Commonwealth.

104 B. Legislative and ex officio members of the Board shall serve terms coincident with their terms of 105 office.

106 C. Appointments to fill vacancies, other than by expiration of a term, shall be for the unexpired 107 terms. Vacancies shall be filled in the same manner as the original appointments. All members may be 108 reappointed.

109 D. After the initial staggering of terms, nonlegislative citizen members shall be appointed for a term 110 of four years.

111 E. No House member shall serve more than four consecutive two-year terms, no Senate member shall 112 serve more than two consecutive four-year terms, and no nonlegislative citizen member shall serve more 113 than two consecutive four-year terms. The remainder of any term to which a member is appointed to fill 114 a vacancy shall not constitute a term in determining the member's eligibility for reappointment.

115 F. The Board shall elect a chairman and vice-chairman from among its membership. A majority of 116 the members shall constitute a quorum. The meetings of the Board shall be held at the call of the chairman or whenever the majority of the members so request. 117

118 G. Legislative members of the Board shall receive such compensation as provided in § 30-19.12, and 119 nonlegislative citizen members shall receive such compensation for the performance of their duties as 120 provided in § 2.2-2813. All members shall be reimbursed for all reasonable and necessary expenses 121 incurred in the performance of their duties as provided in §§ 2.2-2813 and 2.2-2825. Funding for the 122 costs of compensation and expenses of the members shall be provided by the Authority.

123 H. George Mason University and Old Dominion University shall provide staff support to the 124 Authority and the Board. All agencies of the Commonwealth shall provide assistance to the Board, upon 125 request. 126

#### § 23.1-3136. Duties of the Authority.

127 The Authority shall:

128 1. Expand access to affordable higher education in the Commonwealth by establishing the Online 129 Virginia Network (the Network) for the purpose of coordinating the online delivery of courses that 130 facilitate the completion of degrees at George Mason University and Old Dominion University;

131 2. Encourage each public institution of higher education and each consortium of public institutions 132 of higher education that offers online courses, online degree programs, or online credential programs to 133 offer any such course, degree program, or credential program through the Network;

134 3. Oversee a process of approval for public institutions of higher education and consortia of such 135 institutions to participate in the Network, with such funds as are appropriated for such purpose and 136 made available to it;

137 4. Serve as a resource for residents of the Commonwealth and disseminate information regarding the 138 opportunities for online learning offered by institutions and consortia that participate in the Network;

139 5. Coordinate the maintenance of an online portal through which potential students may examine 140 and enroll seamlessly in Network offerings;

141 6. Collaborate with institutions and consortia that participate in the Network to ensure that the needs 142 of enrolled students are met before, during, and after enrollment through online student support systems; 143 7. To the extent practicable, ensure that courses and degree programs offered through the Network (i) are accredited by an accrediting agency recognized by the U.S. Department of Education or 144 145 authorized by the Council, as applicable; (ii) expand access to underserved populations based on income, race, geography, and age; (iii) are responsive to the employment demands of the 146 147 Commonwealth; (iv) employ learning and delivery technologies, which may include competency-based 148 and experiential learning, in an efficient and cost-effective manner to promote flexibility for each student 149 to pursue online courses and programs at his own pace and in his own location throughout the year; 150 (v) minimize student expenses and reduce time-to-degree or time-to-credential; and (vi) are offered in 151 collaboration with existing public and private providers of online courses;

152 8. Promote the refinement and implementation of articulation agreements to ensure that credits earned through the Network are transferable to each other public institution of higher education and 153 154 contribute to on-time degree completion at each such institution;

155 9. Assist in developing processes to help institutions and consortia that participate in the Network to 156 expand their online offerings:

10. Develop specific goals for meeting the demand in the Commonwealth for affordable and 157 158 accessible higher education through online learning;

159 11. Review and report annually to the Governor and the General Assembly on the cost structure of 160 funds allocated to the establishment, maintenance, and expansion of the Network. In addition, the 161 Authority shall examine ways to reduce the cost of online education and develop a budget that 162 incorporates estimated expected tuition revenue from online students and its use in supporting the 163 Network and assumes that any financial aid will come from existing financial aid programs; and

164 12. Accept, administer, and account for any state, federal, or private moneys that it may receive. Any 165 moneys, including interest thereon, that have not been expended by the Authority by the end of each fiscal year shall not revert to the general fund but shall remain in the accounts of the Authority. 166 167

§ 23.1-3137. Procurement and information technology.

168 A. The Authority shall be exempt from the provisions of the Virginia Public Procurement Act 169 (§ 2.2-4300 et seq.), except for § 2.2-4342, which shall not be construed to require compliance with the prequalification application procedures of subsection B of § 2.2-4317, if it adopts and complies with 170 171 policies for the procurement of goods and services, including professional services, that (i) are based 172 upon competitive principles; (ii) in each instance seek competition to the maximum practical degree; 173 (iii) implement a system of competitive negotiation for professional services pursuant to §§ 2.2-4303.1 174 and 2.2-4302.2; (iv) prohibit discrimination in the solicitation and award of contracts based on the 175 bidder's or offeror's race, religion, color, sex, national origin, age, or disability or on any other basis 176 prohibited by state or federal law; (v) incorporate the prompt payment principles of \$ 2.2-4350 and 177 2.2-4354; (vi) consider the impact on correctional enterprises under § 53.1-47; (vii) provide that 178 whenever solicitations are made seeking competitive procurement of goods or services, it shall be a

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priority of the Authority to provide for fair and reasonable consideration of small, women-owned, and
minority-owned businesses and to promote and encourage a diversity of suppliers; and (viii) identify the
public, educational, and operational interests served by any procurement rule that deviates from
procurement rules in the Virginia Public Procurement Act (§ 2.2-4300 et seq.).

183 B. The Authority shall be exempt from the provisions governing the Virginia Information
184 Technologies Agency in Chapter 20.1 (§ 2.2-2005 et seq.) of Title 2.2 and the provisions governing the
185 Information Technology Advisory Council in Article 35 (§ 2.2-2699.5 et seq.) of Chapter 26 of Title 2.2,

186 if it adopts and complies with policies and professional best practices regarding strategic planning for

187 information technology, project management, security, budgeting, infrastructure, and ongoing operations.

188 2. That the initial appointments of nonlegislative citizen members of the Online Virginia Network 189 Authority Board of Trustees, as created by this act, shall be staggered as follows: one member for

190 a term of two years appointed by the board of visitors of George Mason University; one member

191 for a term of three years appointed by the board of visitors of Old Dominion University; and

192 three members for a term of four years appointed by the Governor.
