That § 23.1-638 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows: 10 § 23.1-638. Eligibility; amount of grants; renewals. 11 A. Only students who (i) are accepted for *full-time* enrollment as dependent students at a public 12 13 institution of higher education; (ii) are not receiving a Virginia Commonwealth Award; (iii) demonstrate financial need as determined by the Council according to the congressional methodology for determining 14 15 financial need and eligibility for financial aid; and (iv) are either (a) Virginia students who graduated from a high school in the Commonwealth with a cumulative grade point average of at least 2.5 on a 16 scale of 4.0 or its equivalent or (b) are dependent children of active duty military personnel residing 17 outside the Commonwealth pursuant to military orders, claiming Virginia on their State of Legal 18 Residence Certificate, and satisfying the domicile requirements for such active duty military personnel 19 20 pursuant to § §§ 23.1-502 and 23.1-504 and graduated from a high school within or outside the Commonwealth with a cumulative grade point average of at least 2.5 on a scale of 4.0 or its equivalent 21 22 are eligible to receive such grants. 23 B. All grants shall be awarded for one award year and may be renewed annually for no more than three subsequent award years as follows: (i) no recipient shall receive a subsequent grant until he has 24 25 satisfied the requirements to advance to the next class level; (ii) no recipient shall receive more than one year of support per class level for a maximum total of two years of support at an 26 27 associate-degree-granting public institution of higher education or more than one year of support per 28 class level for a maximum total of four years of support at a baccalaureate public institution of higher 29 education; and (iii) no recipient shall receive more than a combined lifetime total of four years of 30 *support*, if the recipient: 31 1. Maintains a cumulative grade point average of at least 2.0 on a scale of 4.0 or its equivalent; 32 2. Demonstrates continued financial need; 3. Makes satisfactory academic progress toward a degree, earning not less than the minimum number of hours of credit required for full-time standing in each academic period during enrollment at a public institution of higher education; and

4. Maintains continuous *full-time* enrollment for not less than two semesters or three quarters in each successive award year unless the Council grants the recipient an exception for cause.

38 C. Beginning with first-time students enrolled in the fall semester in 2018, public institutions of 39 higher education may provide larger awards to students in a higher class level or to students who 40 enroll in 15 or more credit hours per semester.

2. That the provisions of this act shall become effective beginning with the first-time entering 41 42 freshman class of the fall 2018 academic year.
