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10	WHEREAS, the Virginia High School League (VHSL) is a § 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization that
11	reported \$8.6 million in revenue and \$9 million in expenses in 2014; and
12	WHEREAS, member schools join VHSL with the consent of their local school boards; and
13	WHEREAS, VHSL has for more than 100 years served the Commonwealth's public high schools and
14	public high school student athletes by facilitating athletic and educational programs and intrastate
15	tournaments, establishing standards, and maintaining rules to govern competitions; and
16 17	WHEREAS, VHSL provides other services, such as offering catastrophic injury insurance and providing training to coaches and officials; and
18	WHEREAS, VHSL has substantial influence on high school athletics programs by serving more than
19	200,000 public high school student athletes and their parents and other family members; now, therefore,
20	be it
21	RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the Joint Legislative Audit and
22	Review Commission be directed to study the Virginia High School League.
23	In conducting its study, the Joint Legislative Audit and Review Commission shall (i) review the
24	usefulness of the functions currently performed by VHSL; (ii) assess how effectively VHSL fulfills its
25	role, including its sanctioning authority; (iii) assess whether there is sufficient transparency and
26	accountability in VHSL executive committee, board, and staff decisions, operations, and funding; (iv)
27 28	compare the role and operations of VHSL with those of similar organizations in other states; (v) assess whether VHSL as currently structured is the best model for performing the functions that VHSL
2 9	currently performs; and (vi) review other issues and make recommendations as appropriate.
30	In conducting its study, the Joint Legislative Audit and Review Commission (JLARC) shall have
31	access to VHSL facilities, employees, information, and records, including confidential information of
32	VHSL and its contractors and records of public and executive session meetings of the VHSL executive
33	committee, in accordance with the established standards, processes, and practices exercised by JLARC
34	pursuant to its statutory authority.
35	Technical assistance shall be provided to the Joint Legislative Audit and Review Commission by the
36	Department of Education and each local school division. All agencies of the Commonwealth shall
37	provide assistance to JLARC for this study, upon request.
38 39	The Joint Legislative Audit and Review Commission shall complete its meetings for the first year by November 30, 2017, and for the second year by November 30, 2018, and the chairman shall submit to
40	the Division of Legislative Automated Systems an executive summary of its findings and
41	recommendations no later than the first day of the next Regular Session of the General Assembly for
42	each year. Each executive summary shall state whether JLARC intends to submit to the General
43	Assembly and the Governor a report of its findings and recommendations for publication as a House or
44	Senate document. The executive summaries and reports shall be submitted as provided in the procedures
45	of the Division of Legislative Automated Systems for the processing of legislative documents and
46	reports and shall be posted on the General Assembly's website.
