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10	WHEREAS, animal control officers are employed by localities for the purpose of enforcing Chapter
11 12	65 (§ 3.2-6500 et seq.) of Title 3.2 of the Code of Virginia, and all ordinances adopted pursuant to that
12 13	chapter, and enforcing all laws for the protection of domestic animals; and WHEREAS, animal control officers have duties, procedures, training, and equipment comparable to
13	other members of local law enforcement; and
15	WHEREAS, currently there is inadequate accountability of animal control officers; and
16	WHEREAS, the sheriff's department of a locality is already equipped to handle many of the duties of
17	animal control officers; and
18	WHEREAS, the reorganization of animal control officers into sheriffs' departments may be more cost
19	effective for localities; and
20 21	WHEREAS, the reorganization of animal control officers into sheriffs' departments may result in better enforcement of the laws of Virginia and protection of domestic animals; and
²¹ 22	WHEREAS, the reorganization of animal control officers into sheriffs' departments may cause
$\frac{12}{23}$	significant financial burden for either party to the reorganization; now, therefore, be it
24	RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the Department of Criminal
25	Justice Services be requested to study the efficiacy of the sheriff of any locality supervising animal
26	control officers.
27	In conducting its study, the Department of Criminal Justice Services shall (i) at its discretion, consult
28	animal control officers, local sheriffs, certified animal control officer training organizations, and any
29 30	other party affected by the efficacy of the sheriff of any locality supervising animal control officers to determine the feasibility of including the supervision of animal control officers in sheriffs' departments'
30 31	duties; (ii) assess the cost or savings to taxpayers that would result from such supervision restructuring;
32	(iii) determine the effectiveness of sheriffs' departments in overseeing animal control officers in
33	enforcing laws for the protection of domestic animals under such reorganization; and (iv) assess the cost
34	to local sheriffs' departments that would result from such reorganization.
35	All agencies of the Commonwealth shall provide assistance to the Department of Criminal Justice
36	Services for this study, upon request.
37	The Department of Criminal Justice Services shall complete its study by November 30, 2017, and shall submit to the Coverner and the Coverner Assembly on everyting summary and a report of its
38 39	shall submit to the Governor and the General Assembly an executive summary and a report of its findings and recommendations for publication as a House or Senate document. The executive summary
40	and report shall be submitted as provided in the procedures of the Division of Legislative Automated
41	Systems for the processing of legislative documents and reports no later than the first day of the 2018
