SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 282

Designating the first week of July, in 2017 and in each succeeding year, as Substance-Exposed Infant Awareness Week in Virginia.

10 WHEREAS, abuse of and dependence on prescription painkillers, heroin, and other opioids have led 11 to an opioid epidemic across the Commonwealth and throughout the nation; and

WHÊREAŜ, prenatal exposure to opioids may cause infants to be born with an opioid dependency
 condition called Neonatal Abstinence Syndrome (NAS); and

14 WHEREAS, babies born with NAS may experience irritability, low birth weight, respiratory 15 conditions, tremors, seizures, feeding difficulties, and other health-related challenges; and

WHEREAS, the rate of opioid abuse and dependence among pregnant women at time of deliveryrose by 910 percent between 2004 and 2014, resulting in five infants per day being born drugdependent; and

19 WHEREAS, the Virginia Department of Health recorded 493 cases of NAS in 2013, an increase of 20 nearly 100 cases over the previous year and an increase of more than 400 cases over 1999; and

WHEREAS, prevention, education, public awareness, and knowledge of available treatment resourcesare crucial to reducing the physical, social, and economic impact of NAS; and

WHEREAS, the Commonwealth is committed to fighting substance abuse and dependence and
 promoting safe environments and the compassionate care necessary to give every newborn the best
 possible start in life; in November 2016, the Virginia Department of Health declared that the opioid
 addiction crisis is a public health emergency in Virginia; now, therefore, be it

27 RESOLVED by the Senate, the House of Delegates concurring, That the General Assembly designate
28 the first week of July, in 2017 and in each succeeding year, as Substance-Exposed Infant Awareness
29 Week in Virginia; and, be it

RESOLVED FURTHER, That the Clerk of the Senate transmit a copy of this resolution to the
 Virginia Department of Health so that members of the department may be apprised of the sense of the
 General Assembly of Virginia in this matter; and, be it

RESOLVED FINALLY, That the Clerk of the Senate post the designation of this week on theGeneral Assembly's website.
