3. Committee: Commerce and Labor

4. Title: Virginia Consumer Protection Act; prohibited practices, etc.

5. Summary: Virginia Consumer Protection Act; engaging in fraudulent or improper or dishonest conduct during a declared state of emergency. Provides that it is a prohibited practice under the Virginia Consumer Protection Act for a supplier to engage in fraudulent or improper or dishonest conduct while engaged in a transaction that was initiated (i) during a declared state of emergency or (ii) to repair damage resulting from the event that prompted the declaration of a state of emergency, regardless of whether the supplier is licensed as a contractor in the Commonwealth of Virginia.

7. Fiscal Impact Estimates: No state fiscal impact.

8. Fiscal Implications: The Attorney General and Department of Law indicates that the provisions of the bill are not expected to create a cost to the State.
