4. Title: Inmate transportation orders

5. Summary:

The proposed legislation would require that, upon request of, and receipt of all necessary information from, the attorney for the Commonwealth or counsel for the defendant, a court issue all orders needed to transport any defendant incarcerated in a state or local correctional facility to the court. The bill would allow a court to authorize a clerk or deputy clerk to issue the orders on behalf of the court.

8. Fiscal Implications:

It is the current policy of the Department of Corrections to release an inmate from one of its facilities to be transported to a jail for a court appearance only upon receipt of an order from the court. Therefore, the proposed legislation would have no effect on the agency.
